As the first President of the Seychelles, Sir James Mancham had a ringside seat to view emerging Cold War struggles for the control of strategic islands in the Indian Ocean. He was eventually overthrown in 1977 in a pro-Marxist coup while on a visit to London. Sir James is an astute observer of the forces that have shaped developing countries and islands, and spawned the breeding grounds of international terrorism. Sir James believes that Seychelles can serve as a model for other countries that are grappling with post-colonial divisions amid a unipolar world, and looks at America's capability to lead the world in a campaign against terrorism after September 11.

Sir James shares an informed and informative look at American foreign policy and its ramifications since the 1960's from this island nation's point of view that cover events up to and including the September 11 terrorist attacks. His timely insights will help students of contemporary international studies, and the general public, to learn how the United States became embroiled in a long term war upon "stateless" terrorism.
