Casey H. Christensen takes the lead on political issues affecting the U.S.–Sweden relationship. Christensen has served at embassies in Ukraine, Nicaragua, Austria, Bolivia, and France during his twenty-year career in the Foreign Service. He has received four Department of State Superior Honor Awards, including for service regarding the Balkan conflicts and proliferation issues. Before joining the Foreign Service, he practiced law in Utah and New Mexico, and he was director (1983–86) and deputy director (1980–83) of the International Student office at BYU. A BYU alumnus, he received a BA in European studies (high honors with distinction, 1974) and a JD from the J. Reuben Clark School of Law (1977).
