Norman G. Finkelstein is a professor of political science at DePaul University in Chicago. The U.S.-born son of Holocaust survivors, Finkelstein is known for his meticulous, scholarly research pertaining to the Israeli–Palestinian conflict. His books include *Beyond Chutzpah: the Misuse of Anti-Semitism and Abuse of History* (2005), the *Holocaust Industry* (2000), *A Nation on Trial* (1998), and *Image and Reality of the Israel–Palestine Conflict* (1995).

Finkelstein's mother, Maryla Finkelstein, survived the Warsaw Ghetto, Majdanek concentration camp, as well as two slave-labor camps. His father, Zacharias Finkelstein, was a survivor of both the Warsaw Ghetto and Auschwitz concentration camp.
