Peter W. Flint, professor of religious studies and co-director of the Dead Sea Scrolls Institute at Trinity Western University in British Columbia, is a widely recognized and acclaimed public speaker, teacher, and motivator. Flint regularly participates in both public seminars and academic meetings on the Dead Sea Scrolls, Biblical topics, and the Christian faith in the U.S., Canada, Europe, and Israel. He is the author of numerous studies on the Dead Sea Scrolls, including the *Dead Sea Psalms Scrolls and the Book of Psalms* (1997), co-author of *Dead Sea Scrolls Bible* (1999), and editor of the major, two-volume collection the *Dead Sea Scrolls After Fifty Years: A Comprehensive Assessment* (1998–99). He also serves as a general editor of one series on the Old Testament: “The Formation and Interpretation of Old Testament Literature” (E. J. Brill), as well as three series on the Dead Sea Scrolls, and has also edited over twenty-five Dead Sea Scrolls for three volumes in the internationally acclaimed series “Discoveries in the Judaean Desert” (Oxford University Press). Flint received a PhD in Old Testament and Second Testament Judaism from the University of Notre Dame (1993).
