Locally produced film series continues April 13 on KBYU.



SALT LAKE CITY, Utah (April 7, 2005)— War is a complicated business. Friendly-fire incidents, collateral damage, and plans that fall apart under the stress of combat are a continual feature of warfare that, if history is any indication, will not disappear from the battlefield. *Fog and Friction* examines the uncertainty of war. **Wednesday, April 13 at 9 pm on KBYU-TV** (channel 11 in most areas).

Fog and Friction is the third episode of *Beyond the Border*, a documentary film series currently airing its second season on KBYU-TV. Produced by Combat Films & Research for the David M. Kennedy Center at Brigham Young University, this series examines events, trends and stories from around the world with an emphasis on international relations. *Beyond the Border* originally debuted in October 2004.

Fog & Friction is a glimpse into the decision making process at the height of battle, and the consequences of those decisions. And, according to military scientists, what is being done on a continual basis to overcome uncertainty on the battlefield.

“In the complex realm of international affairs, there are untold stories that can help us gain a greater understanding of our world,” said Jeff Ringer, Kennedy Center director and creator of the program concept. “Through this series, we hope to provide an alternative perspective on forces, ideas, and facts that are beyond the border of our common experience.”
