Sir David G. Manning became ambassador in 2003. Manning, who joined the Foreign Service in 1972, has held various postings in Warsaw, New Delhi, Paris, Moscow, Tel Aviv, and Brussels. In 2000, he became the U.K. permanent representative to NATO and foreign policy advisor to Prime Minister Tony Blair, a position he held until his current appointment. In 1994, he also served as the British member of the ICTY Contact Group on Bosnia. Three years ago, he was made knight commander, Order of St. Michael and St. George. Manning read history at Oriel College, Oxford, after which he spent a year at the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies in Bologna, Italy. His wife, Lady Catherine, has authored five mystery novels.
