János Sipos is a specialist in tracing, through folksong, the ancient musico-linguistic trail of the Hungarian migrations from further east. He has spent many years collecting and classifying the songs of linguistically-related tribal peoples in Turkey, Kazakhstan, and

Mongolia. As a Fulbright Visiting Scholar at UCLA, he is currently investigating possible musical connections between those Central Asian peoples and certain Native American tribes, including the Navajo.
