Course Offerings for Russian

The US Department of Education provides some flexibility in determining which courses fulfill the language and area studies courses. Brigham Young University has been granted Russian as an Asian language with the understanding that Russian FLAS recipients would study the interactions of Russia with Asia. In order to assist students in making course selections, the FLAS committee has created a list of pre-approved courses that fulfill FLAS requirements.

Course Substitutions

Do your best to arrange your schedule to take courses listed above. Nevertheless, course substitutions may be made due to schedule conflicts or lack of course offerings. You must submit a formal course substitution request in the form of a memo. Your request must be approved in writing by the FLAS program coordinator, the FLAS selection committee chair, and the coordinator of Asian Studies.

Include the following in your substitution request:

- the course you wish to take
- a justification for the substitution

- a copy of the syllabus
- a letter of support from the professor

Note: Students in the Law School may potentially count *one* law class as an area studies course, but they must follow the process outlined above.
