SPRING/SUMER 2024: **MARCH 3, 2025**

In the Xhosa language of South Africa, *khwezilomso* is the term for “morning star,” the first star of the morning that signals the beginning of a new day filled with bright promises. This term represents the envisioned impact of this endowed fund for students in the Africana Studies program at BYU. The Khwezilomso Endowed Fund provides financial support in the form of scholarships, internships, travel grants (e.g. for research projects, conference, or other experiential learning opportunities), to students who are involved in Africana Studies, with a preference for students with a greater financial need and students who are from Africa (regardless of the students’ nationality or national origin). The funds are administered by the Kennedy Center through the Africana Studies program. Recipients will be chosen by a committee of Africana Studies program faculty. Amounts will vary according to the number and nature of the applications.

Who should apply?

All students involved in the Africana Studies program are invited to apply for scholarship money (including for study abroad programs), for grants for internships, for travel grants to attend conferences or conduct studies or research, etc. Previous recipients may apply.

How do I apply?

Complete the Khwezilomso Endowed Fund in Africana Studies application form that follows. Combine the application, transcript, personal statement, and all other supporting documentation ***into one pdf file labeled with your name and the semester for which you are applying***. If you are applying for a scholarship to study abroad, for an internship, or travel grant, please include an **estimated budget**.

If you are applying to support travel to conduct research or studies, you will need to also include a 1-2 page **research proposal** outlining your research question, its significance, and your plan for carrying out the research, including a budget.
