COSTA RICA PLANT AND WILDLIFE SCIENCES

STUDY ABROAD SPRING 2023



Have you ever wondered what it would be like to hear howler monkeys bellowing their booming voice the rain forest canopy? Or to swim through the incredibly colorful coral of Costa Rica's Pacific coast? This trip is going to take you on a voyage through some of the world's most spectacular tropical landscapes, home to an array of diverse and unique plant and animal species. You will have an opportunity to meet and interact with indigenous people and cultures, explore the Caribbean coast, hike in the Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve and Arenal Volcano National Park, and observe tropical wildlife—experiences that could change your life. This trip fulfills the BYU motto: making the world our campus.

HOUSING

The group will stay in affordable but neat and clean hostels and hotels in Costa Rica. Most places have internet access, kitchens to prepare food, laundry facilities, and other amenities. All housing will be safe and arranged by BYU International Study Programs.

COURSES

All participants will enroll in 2 credit hours of PWS 494R—Biogeography, Ecology, and Natural History of Costa Rica. Students may not take any other courses on this program, including BYU Online courses, without approval by the program director and ISP.

COST

\$1,900-2,400

Includes Latter-day Saint undergraduate tuition for two credits, accommodations, transportation and entrance fees for program activities and program excursions, some group meals, and international health insurance coverage.

Does not include airfare to and from the United States, preparation course tuition, food, or miscellaneous (optional) expenses.

TRAVEL

PREPARATION

All students who are accepted into the program are expected to register for a 1 credit, pre-departure preparation class held during the second block of winter semester. BYU students are expected to keep all aspects of the BYU Honor Code and ISP rules during the program.

Students must meet all country- and program-specific COVID and health requirements for travel.

FUNDING SOURCES

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs. Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for a study abroad scholarship and may be considered for other scholarships. They must indicate on their original online application that they want to be considered for financial aid.

Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants.

Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships).

APPLICATION PROCESS

Applicants should note that this program is highly competitive and seats fill quickly. It is strongly suggested that applicants consider alternative programs once the trip roster is full.

Students must be adults 18 years of age or older to participate. Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/isp-apply. A nonrefundable \$35 fee is required; applicants will be interviewed once the application is complete. We are planning on taking approximately 20 students, who will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program. The first payment is due upon acceptance.
