FRANCE

INTERNSHIPS 2023



Students of this internship are selected for work in four areas:

- Social services with the elderly at les Petits Frères des Pauvres [PFP] (typically in Paris, Marseilles or Toulouse);
- Administration at the Faculté de Gestion, Économie, et Sciences at Université Catholique de Lille;
- International trade at the U.S. Commercial Service in Paris:
- Education as English assistants for the French Ministry of Education TAPIF program (which assigns the location and assists the intern with obtaining a visa and providing health insurance)

DATES

Internships are available winter, spring (8-wk and 12-wk), summer, and fall semesters. The U.S. Commercial Service Internship is available winter and fall.

Winter: January-April 2023 Spring: May-June 2023

Summer (*for the Petits Frères des Pauvres only): June-August 2023

Fall: September-December 2023

HOUSING

The Petits Frères des Pauvres and Université Catholique de Lille typically provide or assist in finding housing. Students with US Commercial Services or TAPIF will be responsible for finding their own housing, though the coordinator can provide suggestions regarding living in France. If students have a host family, meals are not provided; however, students will have access to the host family's kitchen.

COURSES

Possible credit hours:

6 minimum for Spring (8 weeks) or Summer; 9–12 for Winter, Spring (12 weeks), or Fall

FREN 399R – Internship (3–6 credit hours)

IAS 380 – Cultural Proofs (1–3 credit hours; substitutes for Fren 36X) or FREN 490R – Individual Study (3 credit hours) FREN 311R – 3^{rd} Year Conversation (2 credit hours), FREN 411R – 4th Year Conversation (2 credit hours)

Participants may not take any other courses on this program, including BYU Online courses, without approval by the program

director and ISP.

COST

Spring–Summer: \$1,500 approximately Fall and winter: \$3,000 approximately

Includes Latter-day Saint undergraduate full tuition (increased cost for graduate and non-Latter-day Saint students); international health insurance coverage (required). The Petits Frères des Pauvres and Université Catholique de Lille typically provide or subsidize housing.

Does not include airfare, meals, prep course tuition, visa (only for TAPIF), or personal expenses.

TRAVEL

Students are responsible for purchasing their own airfare to and from the program sites. Airfare reservations must be made through BYU Travel. Students should contact a BYU Travel agent at 280 HRCB, (801) 422-6293, or travel@byu.edu

PREPARATION

Students must have completed FREN 321—Advanced French Part 1 (advanced grammar) prior to leaving for the internship. Accepted students are required to participate in an international preparation course (IAS 369R 1 credit hour), which will take place 2nd block winter semester (time TBD). Accompanying spouses need to be credit-bearing participants on the program. Spouses will also need to apply online and take the preparation course.

Students must meet all country- and program- specific COVID and health requirements for travel.

FUNDING SOURCES

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to internship programs. Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for an ISP scholarship and may be considered for other scholarships. Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants. (The College of Humanities, for example, may have funds for minors and majors in any humanities program.) Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships).

APPLICATION PROCESS

BYU welcomes students from any university to apply to participate on our study abroad programs. However, internships and direct enrollment programs are limited to BYU Provo students.

Students must be 18 years of age or older to participate.

Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/isp-apply. A nonrefundable \$35 application fee is required; applicants will be interviewed once the application is complete.

Students will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program. The first payment is due upon acceptance.

Students can stay in France and the Schengen Treaty Zone (most of Western Europe) for up to 90 days without a visa. Students in the TAPIF program, however, receive a visa and remain in country for 8 months.
