EUROPEAN CHURCH HISTORY

COLLECT, PRESERVE, AND SHARE THE HISTORY OF THE CHURCH IN EUROPE

INTERNSHIPS: WINTER, SPRING-SUMMER, FALL 2023



The history of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Europe is rich and vibrant. From the stories of the earliest converts of the British Isles in the 1830s to the experiences of Latter-day Saints where the Church is still only emerging, European Church history offers examples of faith, perseverance, and inspiration. The Church History Department in Europe invites students to help collect, preserve, and share this history through a mentored internship experience. This learning experience is intended for students with an interest in history, language, writing, and related fields but is open to students of any major. Participants can expect an experience customized to fit their interests and develop their skills. Church history activities in Europe are led from the Church's offices in Frankfurt, Germany, but extend to every nation.

HOUSING

Students will be guided to housing within areas that projects will take place and will arrange their own living space.

COURSES

Students will enroll in the following courses while on this program:

HIST 299R—Academic Internship or HIST 496R—Academic Internship: Family, Local, and Social History (3-6 credits) HIST 495R—Directed Research (3 credits)

TRAVEL

PREPARATION

Accepted students are required to participate in our Study Abroad preparation course (IAS 201R, 1 credit hour). Accompanying spouses need to be credit-bearing participants on the program. Spouses will also need to apply online and take

the preparation course.

Students must meet all country- and program- specific COVID and health requirements for travel.

FUNDING SOURCES

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs.

Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for a study abroad scholarship and may be considered for other scholarships.

Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants.

Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships).

APPLICATION PROCESS

BYU welcomes students from any university to apply to participate on our study abroad programs. However, internships and direct enrollment programs are limited to BYU Provo students.

Students must be 18 years of age or older to participate.

Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/isp-apply. A nonrefundable \$35 application fee is required; applicants will be interviewed once the application is complete.

Students will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program. The first payment is due upon acceptance.
