STUDY ABROAD FALL 2023



City-based Design Weeks provide design practitioners large venues to exhibit their work and discuss current design issues. Dutch Design Week (DDW), which takes place in Eindhoven, Netherlands, is the largest design event in northern Europe and one of the most vibrant as a channel for experimental designers. With more than 2,600 designers exhibiting work in over one hundred locations across the city, students will have plenty to see and do. This study abroad focuses on activities, workshops, and research efforts at DDW. A short amount of time will be spent in Amsterdam to visit the Rijks, and other museums, a few notable design stores, and eat Dutch pancakes.

HOUSING

Students will be housed in local hotels in Eindhoven and Amsterdam.

COURSES

Required:

Each student will register for INDES 338R 001, ID Field Study Seminar, for 2.0 credit hours during fall semester 2023. This course will be part of the student's regular semester academic load. This program is open to all design students; design students can receive elective credit for INDES 338R.

COST

\$3,200 - \$3,700

(For industrial design students attending DDW for the first time, the College of Engineering will provide a scholarship to reduce this cost.)

Included: Airfare, local housing, transportation, some entrance fees, and international health insurance.

Not included: Food, personal expenses.

PREPARATION

Accepted students are required to participate in an international, cross-cultural preparation course (IAS 201R, 1.0 credit hour). This course will be held first block of fall semester 2023. Part-time BYU students will need to pay an additional tuition fee of approximately \$331.

Students must meet all country- and program-specific COVID and health requirements for travel.

FUNDING SOURCES

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans can be applied to Study Abroad programs. Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application, and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB), will be considered for a Study Abroad scholarship. Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants. Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see kennedy.byu.edu/isp/financial-aid).

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students must be 18 years of age or older. Complete the online application at kennedy.byu.edu/apply. A non-refundable \$35 application fee is required. Applicants will interview once the application is complete and will be notified via e-mail of their acceptance into the program.
