Major Bell serves as Teaching Faculty and Deputy Department Chair, Global Security Intelligence Studies, College of Strategic Intelligence, National Intelligence University. Maj Bell graduated from Texas A&M University with a bachelor's in Political Science and commissioned into the United States Air Force in May 2010. He later earned his master's degree in Strategic Security from The George Washington University, DC. Following technical training at Goodfellow AFB, TX, Maj Bell was assigned to the 614th Air and Space Operations Center, Vandenberg AFB, Calif where he served as Senior Intelligence Duty Officer, and Deputy Chief, Analysis, Correlation, and Fusion Team. Maj Bell was later assigned to the Defense Intelligence Agency, Washington, DC where he served in a variety of duties to include: Deputy Chief, Human Intelligence and Open-Source Intelligence Requirements Branch; Chief, Transnational Collection Strategy Team, Joint Staff Intelligence Directorate, Pentagon; and Counter-Terrorism Analyst with the Office of the Chief Prosecutor, Office of Military Commissions for the 9-11 conspirators, and USS Cole bomber.
