The Israeli-Palestinian Conflict

Philip H. Gordon is the Mary and David Boies senior fellow in U.S. foreign policy at the Council on Foreign Relations and a senior advisor to the Albright Stonebridge Group (in the Europe and Middle East Practices). Previously, Gordon was special assistant to the president and White House coordinator for the Middle East, North Africa, and the Gulf Region.

The Rise of Authoritarian Nationalism

Madeleine K. Albright is chair of Albright Stonebridge Group, a global strategy firm, and chair of Albright Capital Management LLC, an investment advisory firm focused on emerging markets. Albright was named the first female Secretary of State and became, at that time, the highest ranking woman in the history of the U.S. government. She received the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor, from President Obama in 2012.

Africa's Strategic Partners

Reuben E. Brigety II is adjunct senior fellow for African peace and security issues at the Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) and dean of the George Washington University's Elliott School of International Affairs. He previously served as the appointed representative of the U.S. to the African Union and permanent representative of the U.S. to the UN Economic Commission of Africa.

Global Cooperation on Migration

Katharine Donato holds the Donald G. Herzberg Chair in International Migration and is director of the Institute for the Study of International Migration in the School of Foreign Service at Georgetown University. Prior to joining the Georgetown faculty, she was on the faculty of Vanderbilt and Rice Universities. Her recent book is *Gender and International Migration: From Slavery to Present* (with Donna Gabaccia). With Douglas Massey (Princeton), she published "Undocumented Migration in a Global Economy: Twenty-First-Century Globalization and Illegal Migration," a special issue of *The ANNALS of The American Academy of Political and Social Science*.

The Increasing Complexity of U.S. National Intelligence

Michael P. Dempsey is the former acting director and deputy director of national intelligence, as well as President Obama's primary intelligence briefer. Dempsey began his intelligence career with the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in 1990 and served in a number of management and analytical positions there, including director of the Office of Transnational Issues, director of the Office of African, Latin America, and Global Issues, and deputy associate director of CIA for military affairs.

U.S. Economic Security and the Future of Work

Cecilia Elena Rouse is dean of the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton University, as well as the Lawrence and Shirley Katzman and Lewis and Anna Ernst professor in the economics of education. Rouse has served as an editor of the *Journal of Labor Economics* and is currently a senior editor of the *Future of Children*. She served a year in the White House at the National Economic Council and for two years as a member of the President's Council of Economic Advisors.

Xi Jinping Power Profile

Elizabeth Economy is the C.V. Starr senior fellow and director for Asia studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. Economy's most recent book is the *Third Revolution: Xi Jinping and the New Chinese State* (2018), which analyzes the contradictory nature of reform under President Xi Jinping. She also authored *By All Means Necessary: How China's Resource Quest is Changing the World* (with Michael Levi, 2014) and the *River Runs Black: The Environmental Challenge to China's Future* (2004; Japanese edition, 2005; Chinese edition, 2011).
