



## Paris

Known as the City of Lights, Paris is one of the world's leading business and cultural centers. Its influence in politics, education, entertainment, media, fashion, science, and the arts makes it one of the world's major global cities. An internship in this city will enhance any resume. Internship placement will be customized to individual student goals and chosen fields. Placement coordinators work with a large variety of companies and placement is determined by many factors, including company needs as well as education, experience, and background. A wide variety of internship fields are available: advertising, agriculture, art, business, communications, computer science/IT, culinary arts, design, drama/theater, fashion, finance/banking, graphic design, healthcare, hotel/hospitality/tourism, international studies, journalism, law, marketing, and psychology. Internships may also be available in Bordeaux.

## **DATES**

Winter semester: 17 January–11 April 2016 (12 weeks)

Spring Term: 25 April–20 June 2016 (8 weeks)

Spring-Summer Terms: 25 April–18 July 2016 (12 weeks)

Fall semester: 5 September–28 November 2016 (12 weeks)

## **HOUSING**

Students live in a single room, with a host family. Meals will not be provided; however, students will have access to the host family's kitchen.

## **COURSES**

Required

Spring Term: Six credit hours of the following: 3 internship credit hours (FREN 399R), 2 credit hours of conversational language (FREN 311R, or 411R), 3 credit hours of cultural proofs (IAS 380), or 3 credit hours of individual study (FREN 490R) for French majors/minors.

Winter, Spring-Summer, and Fall: Students are required to enroll in 9–12 credit hours per semester. Courses may include FREN 399R, FREN 490R, IAS 380, FREN 311, and/or FREN 411. Some of these courses count toward the French major/minor.

## **COST**

\$2,500–3,000

Included LDS undergraduate tuition (increased cost for graduate and non-LDS students), accommodations, internship placement fee, and international health insurance coverage.

Airfare, meals, transportation, personal expenses, or passport fee.

## **PREPARATION**

Students must have completed FREN 321 (advanced grammar) prior to leaving for the internship.

Accepted students are required to participate in an international preparation course (IAS 369R, 1 credit hour). This second-block evening course will be held Thursdays, 4:00–6:00 p.m., during winter semester 2016.

Accompanying spouses need to be credit-bearing participants on the program. Spouses will also need to apply online and take the preparation course.

## **FUNDING SOURCES**

Regular BYU tuition scholarships, Pell Grants, and Federal Insured Student Loans may be applied to study abroad programs.

Students who submit the financial aid section of the ISP application and who have a current FAFSA form on file at the Financial Aid Office (A-41 ASB) will be considered for a Study Abroad scholarship.

Academic departments and colleges may assist with scholarships and grants. Private grants and scholarships outside of BYU may also assist (see [kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships](http://kennedy.byu.edu/scholarships)).

The College of Humanities Internship Scholarships may be available for French majors and double-majors. Please check with Professor LeBras for details.
