Han Dong-man was appointed Consul General of the Republic of Korea in May 2013. Prior to his post in San Francisco, Han served as director-general of the International Economic Affairs Bureau of the Korean Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2011–13). His other posts include minister-counselor at the Korean Embassy in Washington, D.C.; director of the Security Policy Division at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade; consul at the Korean Consulate General of in New York; and secretary posts in Algeria, the UK, Australia, and in the president's office in Korea. Han received the Order of the Service Medal in 2012, and he has written four

books, including the *Next 10 Years*, an insightful look at the future of Korea on the international stage for the decade to come. He received a bachelor's degree at Yonsei University in Korea and a master's degree in international organization law at the Pantheon-Sorbonne University in Paris. Han and his wife are the parents of two sons.
