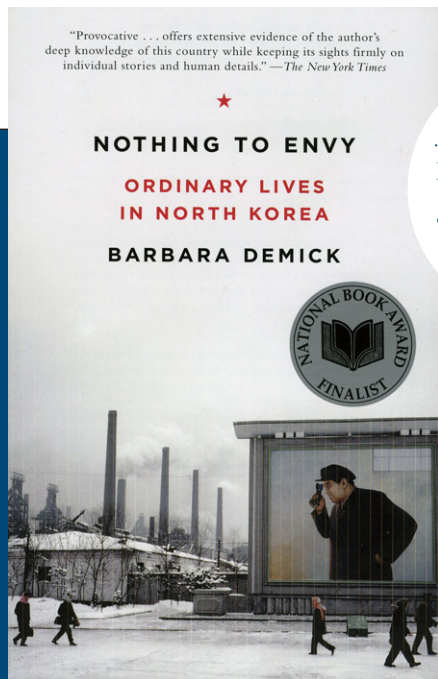

Barbara Demick has been interviewing North Koreans about their lives since 2001, when she moved to Seoul for the *Los Angeles Times*. Demick's reporting on North Korea won the Overseas Press Club award for human rights reporting, the Asia Society's Osborne Elliott award, and the American Academy of Diplomacy's Arthur Ross Award. Before joining the *Los Angeles Times*, she was with the *Philadelphia Inquirer* as a foreign correspondent in the Middle East and Eastern Europe. She lived in Sarajevo during the war in Bosnia and her book about daily life, *Logavina Street: Life and Death in a Sarajevo Neighborhood*, was published in April. Her Sarajevo reporting won the George Polk Award, the Robert F. Kennedy Award, and was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize.
