John M. Hunt

ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF HISTORY, UTAH VALLEY UNIVERSITY

John M. Hunt is an assistant professor of history at Utah Valley University and previously taught at the University of Louisville and the University of North Florida. Hunt's research pertains to the papal *sede vacante*, the vacant see—the time from a pope's death until the election of his successor. He was a Fulbright scholar to Italy, and his research has been funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Renaissance Society of America.

His publications include several articles on the conclave, papal elections, and the pope's death, and his book *Violence and the Vacant See in Early Modern Rome* will be out in late 2014. Hunt received a BA in history from Indiana University Southeast (1998), an MA in Medieval and Renaissance history from the University of Cincinnati (2000), and a PhD in Italian Renaissance history from The Ohio State University (2009).
