Robert D. Griffiths is a career member of the U.S. Foreign Service with overseas postings overseas in Bogota, Colombia; Thailand; Kaohsiung and Taipei with the American Institute in Taiwan; and Shanghai and Beijing on the Chinese mainland. Most recently Griffiths served as senior course adviser at the Foreign Service Institute in Arlington, Virginia. In Washington, he has served in the Bureau of Economic Affairs and as deputy director for Mainland Southeast Asia in the

Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs. Outside the Department of State, he worked in the Asia Policy Office of the Office of the Secretary of Defense and served a year in the U.S. Senate in the office of Harry Reid of Nevada, his home state senator, as part of the State Department's Pearson Program. Griffiths speaks Thai and Chinese and is married with three grown children.
