Adeline Hinderer is the deputy head of Trade and Agriculture for the European Union Delegation in Washington, D.C. Since joining the delegation in 2011, Hinderer has worked on a range of transatlantic trade and investment issues and follows issues related to American and European trade with Asia. Currently, she plays a key role in the launch of negotiations for a Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership. She also coordinates closely with EU Member State trade representatives and manages the delegation's outreach on trade-related issues. Her career with the EU began at the European Commission in Brussels in 2005, where she specialized in bilateral and multilateral negotiations on services and investments. Subsequently she worked

in the team handling trade relations between the EU and China. Before joining the European Commission, Hinderer worked for a federation of multinational companies as an advisor on social, environmental, and sustainability issues. She received an MA in European affairs from the College of Europe in Bruges, graduated from the Institut d'Etudes Politiques in Strasbourg, and studied international relations at Georgetown University. Hinderer is a French national married to an American, and they are the parents of one son.
