Sidnie White Crawford

WILLA CATHER PROFESSOR OF CLASSICS AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES,
UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA—LINCOLN

Sidnie White Crawford is the Willa Cather Professor of Classics and Religious Studies and the University of Nebraska—Lincoln. Prior to joining UNL in 1997, Crawford taught at Albright College in Reading, PA. Most recently she was a visiting scholar at the Oxford Centre for Hebrew and Jewish Studies at the University of Oxford. Her research focuses on the Dead Sea Scrolls, with special interests in questions of the text and canon of scripture. Her most recent book is *Rewriting Scripture in Second Temple Times* (2008), and she has published over seventy-five articles on various topics concerning the scrolls. A member of the international committee responsible for the *editio princeps* of the Qumran scrolls, she was responsible for the critical editions of nine Deuteronomy manuscripts and four manuscripts of the Reworked

Pentateuch group, all of which were published in the series *Discoveries in the Judaean Desert*. Crawford has received fellowships from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the American Council of Learned Societies, and the Dorot Foundation. She is chair of the Board of Trustees of the W.F. Albright Institute of Archaeological Research, a trustee of the American Schools of Oriental Research, and she serves on numerous editorial boards. Crawford received a BA with Honors and Phi Beta Kappa in religion and music from Trinity College (1981), an MTS in biblical studies from Harvard Divinity School (1984), and a PhD with distinction from the Department of Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations at Harvard University (1988).
