He serves as a member of the Institute of the Americas Board of Directors at La Jolla, California, the Maria Moors Cabot Prize Board of the Graduate School of Journalism at Columbia University, and of Grupo de Conjuntura Internacional (GACINT). In 1993, he was awarded the Prêmio Abril de Reportagem, and in 1987, he received the Maria Moors Cabot Award of Journalism. Sotero received a BA in history from the Catholic University of Pernambuco, Brazil, and an MA in journalism and public affairs from the American University in Washington, D.C.
