Darnton became the Carl H. Pforzheimer University Professor at Harvard University, and director of its library, after having taught at Princeton University (1968–2007). He has been a visiting professor or fellow at many universities and institutes for advanced study. Among his honors are a MacArthur Prize Fellowship, a National Book Critics Circle Award, election to the French Legion of Honor, the Del Duca World Prize in the Humanities awarded by the Institut de France in 2013, and the National Humanities Medal conferred by President Obama in February 2012. His numerous publications include the *Case for Books* and the *Devil in the Holy Water* or *The Art of Slander in France from Louis XIV to Napoleon*. Darnton received an AB from Harvard University and a BPhil and DPhil from Oxford University, where he was a Rhodes scholar.
