GENERAL DIRECTOR OF FOREIGN POLICY, MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, COSTA RICA

Jairo Hernández is general director of foreign policy at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Costa Rica and the former deputy permanent representative at the Permanent Mission of Costa Rica to the UN. Hernández is also a professor of political science at the University of Costa Rica, where he has been an instructor in several Study Abroad Programs for foreign students, including ICDS since 2000. He served as director of the president's office in the government of Costa Rica (1994–98) and was the assistant to the minister of foreign affairs in two administrations. Previous to that he

served as international programs officer and deputy director of the Costa Rica Foundation for Sustainable Development, as consultant for several private-sector organizations in Costa Rica and Central America, and is on the Board of Directors for Cathay Bank, a private Costa Rican financial institution. Hernández received a master's degree in law and international Relations from Tufts University, Licenciatura Degrees in law and political science from the University of Costa Rica, and a Certificate of Specialization in Latin American studies from the University of Brasilia in Brazil.
