Fred Axelgard is vice president of Middle East business development at General Dynamics Corporate Headquarters in Falls Church, Virginia. Previously, Axelgard worked as a State Department liaison for the U.S. Central Command in Tampa, Florida, a coordinator for Iraqi opposition groups at the Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs, and a counselor for political-military affairs at the U.S. Embassy in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. He was a special assistant for regional security for the Bureau of Near Eastern affairs and the director of WMD proliferation policy and policy analysis Bureau of Politico-Military Affairs at the Department of State. His op-ed pieces have appeared in the *Washington Post*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Christian Science Monitor*, and *Atlanta Constitution-Journal*, and his articles include “Saudi Arabia: The Islamic State” (2001), “U.S. Support for

the British Position in Pre-revolutionary Iraq” (1991), “A New Iraq? The Gulf War and Implications for U.S. Policy” (1988), and “Revitalizing U.S. Leadership in the Middle East” (1988). He has been invited to lecture to the Foreign Policy Association (1987), the Council on Foreign Relations (1988), the Middle East Institute (1988; 1990), and the Harvard Center for Science and International Affairs (1991), and he has been interviewed by NBC Nightly News, ABC News, Larry King, BBC World Service, and National Public Radio. Fluent in German, French, Arabic, and Armenian, Axelgard’s educational background includes a BA in political science and German from Brigham Young University, an MA in law and diplomacy and a PhD in philosophy from the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy.
