After graduating from the University of Alexandria, Adel El-Daba worked as a news announcer for four years. Uncomfortable with what he was asked to say, El-Daba left broadcasting to dedicate his life to educating young people. Soon after the crowds gathered in Tahrir Square, he bid his wife and children good bye, joined the demonstrations, and soon became a member of the media

committee. After Hosni Mubarak stepped down, El-Daba participated in humanitarian missions to deliver supplies to Libya. He is currently in Provo as the teacher apprentice trainer for BYU's STARTALK Arabic Summer Camp for high school students. Upon his return to Cairo, El-Daba will host a talk show for Egyptian Satellite TV, in addition to his regular academic responsibilities.
