Wade Jacoby is a professor of political science and director of the BYU Center for the Study of Europe. Jacoby is the author of two books, *Imitation and Politics: Redesigning*

*Modern Germany* (Cornell) and the *Enlargement of the EU and NATO: Ordering from the Menu in Central Europe* (Cambridge) and about forty articles and book chapters. Before coming to BYU, he worked as a legislative assistant in the U.S. House of Representatives. He received the DAAD Prize for his scholarship on Germany and the EU and was recently a fellow at the European University Institute. He is currently co-editor of *German Politics* and serves on the editorial boards of *Governance* and *European Security*.



Richard W. Evans is an assistant professor of economics at BYU. Evans' recent research includes, "Is Openness Inflationary? Imperfect Competition and Monetary Market Power" and "Game

Over: Quantifying and Simulating Unsustainable Fiscal Policy." Prior to joining the faculty at BYU, he was a researcher for the Joint Economic Committee of the U.S. Congress, the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, and a research economist at Thredgold Economic Associates in Salt Lake City, providing state and national economic analysis for Zions Bank and their operations in eight western states. He received a BA in economics and an MA in public policy from BYU and a PhD in economics from the University of Texas—Austin.
