Jeanne-Nicole Saint-Laurent is an assistant professor of religious studies at St. Michael's College in Vermont. Saint-Laurent teaches classes in Syriac, early Christianity, Saints and Holiness, and Eastern Orthodoxy. She is currently finishing a book entitled *Syriac Missionary Legends*, a project on the cult of St. Febronia of Nisibis, a translation of the East Syriac *Life* of Mar Behnam, and plans to begin a general *Introduction to Syriac Hagiography* next year. Saint-Laurent received a BA *summa cum laude* in religious studies and classics from Gonzaga University, an MA in early Christian studies from the University of Notre Dame (2002), and a PhD in religious studies from Brown University (2009), and she was the recipient of

a Fulbright Grant to Austria (2002–03) and a Junior Fellowship in Byzantine Studies at Dumbarton Oaks Research Center in Washington, D.C. (2008–09).
