DIPLOMAT-IN-RESIDENCE, ARIZONA STATE UNIVERSITY

Philip Egger, diplomat-in-residence, arrived at Arizona State University in August 2011. Egger has been a Foreign Service officer with the Department of State since 1980 and currently holds the rank of minister-counselor. He has had a wide variety of assignments both overseas and in Washington, with his most recent assignment as consul general at the U.S. Embassy in Rome, Italy. From 2007 to 2008, he served as the team leader for the Provincial Reconstruction Team for Muthanna Province in Iraq and, later, as the senior American officer of the Italian-led PRT in Dhi Qar Province. Prior to Iraq, Egger was the political counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Buenos Aires, Argentina. From 2000 to 2003, he served

as chief of consular services in Tijuana, Mexico. Overseas he has also served in Venezuela, South Africa, Zambia, Bulgaria, and Bosnia-Herzegovina, where he was the political advisor to the commanding general of U.S. peacekeeping forces. Egger received a BA from Vanderbilt University and an MS from the National Defense University's Industrial College of the Armed Forces.
