David Taylor joined Wolfson College after having taught at the University of Birmingham (1993–2003). Taylor's research interests revolve around the literature, history, and theology of the Syriac Churches, and the Syriac and Aramaic versions of the Bible. Among his many publications, Taylor is co-editor of and a contributor to a three-volume introduction to the Syrian Orthodox Church and its Aramaic heritage, appropriately entitled, the *Hidden Pearl* (2001), editor and translator of the *Syriac Versions of the De Spiritu Sancto by Basil of Caesarea* (1999), co-editor (with D.C. Parker) of the series *Texts and Studies*, and the editor of the *Library of the Christian East*, a series published by Brigham Young University Press. Taylor received both an MA and a DPhil degree from the University of Oxford.
