Abderahman Salaheldin was appointed the consul general of Egypt in San Francisco on 1 September 2004. Salaheldin’s office covers Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming. Prior to his appointment, he had been deputy assistant minister of foreign affairs for North America (2002–04). His long foreign service career, which began in 1980, includes being minister for political and congressional affairs at the Embassy of Egypt in Washington, D.C. (1998–2002); director of UN affairs at Egypt’s Ministry of Foreign Affairs (1996–98); political counselor in the Permanent Mission of Egypt at the UN in New York, dealing with the Middle East and peace keeping issues and serving as the rapporteur of the UN Peace Keeping Committee (1992–96).
