Nicholas Whyte is an Honorary Senior Research Fellow at the Institute of Governance, Public Policy, and Social Research of Queen's University of Belfast. Whyte's research interest is Northern Ireland elections. He was previously communications manager and research fellow at the Centre for European Policy Studies (CEPS) in Brussels, where he was their principal Balkans analyst, editing the monthly *Europa South-East Monitor*. He lived in Bosnia and Herzegovina (Republika Srpska) and Croatia while working for the National Democratic Institute (1997–98). His recent publications include the *Future of Montenegro* (ed. 2001); "America's Balkan Disengagement?" with Marta Dassù (in *Survival*, Volume 43, Number 4, winter 2001, pp. 123–136); and *Science, Colonialism, and Ireland* (1999).
