

# Is the Atlantic Alliance Dead? U.S.–European Relations in the George W. Bush Era

David M. Andrews' research interests are Atlantic political, security, and economic relations; economic statecraft, international monetary relations, and international economic governance; and European integration, especially European monetary integration. Andrews has won awards for outstanding teaching and for outstanding research at Scripps. In addition to his appointment at Scripps, he is an adjunct professor in the School of Politics and Economics at Claremont Graduate University. The European Union Center of California at Scripps, under his direction, promotes education, scholarly research, and public understanding of European integration and its consequences. The center's programs are conducted collaboratively with the other Claremont Colleges: Pomona College, Pitzer College, Claremont McKenna College, Harvey Mudd College, and Claremont Graduate University, and with other institutions of higher learning. Andrews has been a

visiting scholar at the London School of Economics and the School of International Relations at University of Southern California. During 2002–04, he was Senior Research Fellow in transatlantic relations at the European University Institute in Florence, Italy. His articles have been published in *International Organization*, *International Studies Quarterly*, *Policy Sciences*, *Journal of European Public Policy*, *Cambridge Review of International Affairs*, and elsewhere. He is also the editor of the *Alliance under Stress: Atlantic Relations after Iraq* (Cambridge University Press, 2005) and co-editor of *Governing the World's Money* (Cornell University Press, 2002). Andrews received a PhD in political science from MIT (1992) and he held a postdoctoral fellowship at Georgetown University's Center for German and European Studies before joining the Scripps College faculty in 1993.
