Christopher Mitchell is currently the Drucie French Cumbie Professor of International Conflict Analysis at George Mason University in Virginia, where he was director of that university's Institute for Conflict Analysis and Resolution from 1991 to 1994. Mitchell continues to work on practical and theoretical aspects of peace making processes and has recently published articles on the theory of entrapment, on ending asymmetric conflicts, and on a multi-role model of mediation. His most recent works are *Gestures of Conciliation: Factors Contributing to Olive Branches* (2000) and *Handbook of Conflict Resolution: The Analytical Problem-solving Approach* (1996). He has held academic positions at University College, London, the London School of Economics, and the University of Southampton. Mitchell was appointed Lecturer in the Department of Systems Science at the City University in 1973 and became Professor of International Relations there in 1983. He joined the academic exodus from Britain in the mid-1980s.
