Zhang Qingmin's research interests include China's foreign policy, U.S. foreign policy, and U.S.–People's Republic of China–Taiwan relations. From September 2004 to July 2005, Zhang was a Fulbright scholar at the Sigur Center for Asian Studies at George Washington University's Elliot School of International Affairs, where he conducted research on China's foreign policy in the context of globalization and U.S. arms sales policy to Taiwan. He was invited to lecture on this topic at Harvard, MIT, and at the prestigious Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars. He is the author of *China's Foreign Relations* (2003), numerous academic journal articles, as well as co-editor and contributor to several books. In China, he is widely recognized for his expertise on foreign policy analysis. Zhang received an MA in international and area studies from the Kennedy Center at Brigham Young University (1998) and a PhD from the China Foreign Affairs College in Beijing.
