 of Social and Political

 of Chicago. Elshtain has authored many books,
 including the *Jane Addams Reader*, *Jane Addams
 and the Dream of American Democracy*, and
*Who Are We? Critical Reflections and Hopeful
 Possibilities*. She edited the *Family in Political
 Thought*; co-edited *Women, Militarism, and War*,
 co-authored *But Was It Just? Reflections on
 the Morality of the Persian Gulf War*, and edited
Politics and the Human Body and *Just War Theory*.
 She has also authored over four hundred articles
 and essays in scholarly journals and journals of
 civic opinion. In 1996, she was elected a Fellow
 of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
 She is the recipient of seven honorary degrees.
 And she is co-chair of the recently established Pew
 Forum on Religion and American Public Life.
