Bradford J Bruton has worked as an open source analyst and collection manager with the Central Intelligence Agency for twenty-three years. In addition to a variety of Washington assignments, Bruton has served seven field tours at regional bureaus with embassies in Panama City (2003–05), London (2001–03), Tel Aviv (1994–97, 1985–87), Bangkok (1988–90), Asuncion (1983–85), and at the Key West Naval Air Station (1990–92). For the past fifteen years, he has been visiting universities for recruiting purposes. He received a BA in history with a minor in Spanish from BYU (1979) after having served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Guatemala. He received a JD from the College of William and Mary (1982), and an HBA in Jewish and biblical studies from the University of South Africa (1999). Bruton married the former Rebecca Jenkins (BYU, 1980) in the Washington, D.C. Temple (1983). They have three children. He has taught LDS Seminary a total of sixteen years.
