John A. Agnew has expertise in the democratic transformation in Italy, sovereignty and territoriality, hegemony versus empire in global geopolitics and the history of geographical thought. Agnew’s publications include *Hegemony: The New Shape of Global Power* (2005), *Geopolitics: Re-Visioning World Politics* (second edition, 2003), *Place and Politics in Modern Italy* (2002), and *Making Political Geography* (2002). He has been the recipient of the Distinguished Scholarship Award from the Association of American Geographers (2006), Guggenheim Fellowship (2003–04), and the Hettner Lectures at the University of Heidelberg (2000). Agnew received a BA with Honors in geography and politics from the University of Exeter, England (1970) and an MA (1973) and a PhD (1976) in geography from the Ohio State University.
