Christian Marchant is a Foreign Service officer currently serving in Prague, Czech Republic, where he earlier served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Marchant was previously stationed in Beijing, China, where he worked in the Environment, Science, Technology, and Health and Political Sections. While in China, he was the embassy's point person on China's energy sector and nonproliferation issues, for which he received a meritorious honor award at the conclusion of his tour in China. Before joining the Foreign Service, Marchant worked for several years on Capitol Hill and in elective politics, where he served as legislative director for Congresswoman Melissa Hart (PA-04) and worked in the Senate for the Senate Judiciary Committee and Senator Mitch McConnell (R-KY). Also he worked on and managed political campaigns in Kentucky, Utah, Delaware, California, and Pennsylvania. He has been a guest lecturer on elective politics and international relations at the University of Pittsburgh, China's Foreign Affairs University, China Academy of Social Sciences, and University of New York in Prague. Marchant received a BA in political science from Brigham Young University (1999).
