Stefan Talmon, who joined Oxford University in 2003, is a tutorial fellow in law at St Anne's College and is the course director for public international law in Oxford's Foreign Service Program in addition to his professorial responsibilities. Talmon was previously both an assistant and an associate professor at Tübingen University (1998–2003). His legal opinions have ranged from international environmental and criminal law to law of the sea and from human rights to terrorism. He has received a number of honors that include an award from the German Research Foundation and the German Foreign Office for his habilitation thesis (2003), the Teacher of the Year Award from the Federal State of Baden-Württemberg (2000), and a Rhodes Scholarship (1991). He is a member of several professional societies including the Society of Legal Scholars, German Society of the United Nations, International Law Association, and the American Society of International Law. Talmon received an MA from Oxford University and became a member of the German Bar in 2003; a DPhil from Oxford University in 1995; and an LLM from Cambridge University in 1989.
