Tanner, 2003), and "Sowing Ideas: Explaining the Origins of Christian Democratic Parties in Latin America" in *Christian Democracy in Latin America: Electoral Competition and Regime Conflicts* (2003). Hawkins received a BA in international relations with Spanish minor (summa cum laude, 1993) and an MA in international and area studies (1995) from Brigham Young University, and he received a PhD in political science from Duke University (2003).
