Roger Gibbins joined the Canada West Foundation, a non-partisan public policy research group based in Calgary, as its president and CEO in 1998. Gibbins is currently a professor of political science at the University of Calgary, where he has taught since 1973 and where he served as department head from 1987 to 1996.

He served as president of the Canadian Political Science Association from 1999 to 2000. He was also elected as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada in 1998.

Gibbins has authored, co-authored, or edited twenty-one books and over 100 articles and book chapters, most dealing



with western Canadian themes and issues. His publications include *Western Visions* (2003), *Parameters of Power: Canada's Political Institutions* (1999), *Mindscales: Political Ideologies Toward the Twenty-First Century* (1996), *Conflict and Unity: An Introduction to Canadian Political Life* (1994), *New Elites in Old States: Ideologies in the Anglo-American Democracies* (1990), and *Regionalism: Territorial Politics in Canada and the United States* (1982).

He was born in Prince George, British Columbia, and received his university training at the University of British Columbia and at Stanford University.
