Hiroshi Ogai joined Keiwa College's faculty after an eight-year stint as a director and chief economist with for Meiko Securities Company in Tokyo (1986–92). Prior to that, he had worked for six years as head of the International Treasury Department at Sumitomo Bank Tokyo main office (1979–85). He had previously worked for the bank in increasingly responsible positions since graduating

from Nagoya University in 1953 until 1972, when he joined Daiwa Europe N.V. in Amsterdam. At Daiwa, he was the managing director of foreign exchange and international finance and treasury. He rejoined Sumitomo Bank as joint general manager of their London Branch (1975–78). In 1954–55, he studied as a Fulbright scholar at Princeton University.
