Daniel C. Peterson currently serves as the director of the Institute for the Study and Preservation of Ancient Religious Texts (ISPART). Peterson has lectured throughout the U.S. and around the globe on Medieval Islamic philosophy and Arabic language and literature. He is editor-in-chief of the Middle Eastern Texts Initiative (Islamic Translation Series; Graeco-Arabic Sciences and Philosophy; Eastern Christian Texts). His numerous publications include *Abraham Divided: An LDS Perspective on the Middle East*, (revised and expanded edition 2001), *The Last Days: Teachings of the Modern Prophets*, (two volumes, 2000), and *Offenders for a Word: How Anti-*



*Mormons Play Word Games to Attack the Latter-day Saints* (with Stephen D. Ricks, 1998). His travel and study began with BYU's Jerusalem Study Abroad program (1978). He also completed intensive studies in Arabic at the Center for Arabic Study Abroad (1981–82) and studies in Arabic and graduate studies in Middle Eastern history at the American University (1978–81), both in Cairo. Peterson received a BA in Greek (minor in philosophy) from Brigham Young University (1977) and a PhD in Near Eastern languages and cultures (Arabic literature, minor in Persian) from the University of California—Los Angeles (1990).
