Amr Al-Azm is teaching courses in anthropology and political science while at BYU. Al-Azm has excavated a number of sites including Tell Hamoukar in Syria and the supposed final burial place of Ghengis Khan in Mongolia. He was head of the Centre for Archaeological Research at the University of Damascus (2003–2006) and was the director of Scientific and Conservation Laboratories at the General Department of Antiquities and Museums (1999–2004). He is also a keen observer of Middle East events, in particular those involving Syria and its neighbors. Educated in the UK, he read the archaeology of the western Asiatics at the University of London, Institute of Archaeology and received a doctorate in 1991.
