David Allen is a chemical and biological issues analyst responsible for providing all source intelligence analysis to the Secretary of State and other senior department officials. Allen is also responsible for intelligence support for several policy areas, including U.S. participation in the Australia Group and efforts to interdict transfers of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) -related technologies. Prior to joining INR, he served for two years as a Foreign Affairs Officer in the State Department's Bureau of Nonproliferation, where he helped to manage a \$60 million program designed to provide opportunities for former WMD scientists in Russia and other former Soviet countries to

redirect their skills towards civilian applications. He had a short-term assignment as a Political Officer at the U.S. Mission to the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), where he helped to support participation in an OSCE Ministerial by Secretary of State Madeleine Albright. He was awarded the Department of State's Meritorious Honor Award for service on the department's crisis task force following the terrorist attacks on the United States in September 2001. Allen received an MA in public policy and BAs in public policy and Russian from Brigham Young University in 1999 before being recruited by the State Department as a presidential management intern.
