In 2004, he had conducted a field study about planning, participation, and development of local democracy in Duncan Village. Currently, he works as the South Africa field study program facilitator and will receive a BS in urban, rural, and environmental planning with an African studies minor from Brigham Young University in December and will leave to pursue a master's degree in development planning at the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa in January. A native of Houston, Texas, he served in the South Africa Durban Mission (1999–2001).
