David Taras is a political science professor and associate dean of general studies at the University of Calgary, where he also directs the graduate programs in communication studies. He previously taught at the University of Amsterdam in the Netherlands. A four-time winner of the Student's Union Award for Teaching Excellence, Taras is known for his work in political communication, news and journalism, and the effects of new information technologies on politics and society. The author of several books and publications, including *Power and Betrayal in the Canadian Media*, the *Newsmakers: the Media's Influence*

on Canadian Politics, and co-editor of *A Passion for Identity: Canadian Studies for the 21st Century*. Taras has worked as a consultant and advisor for the Canadian and Alberta governments and served as president of the Canadian Communication Association (1998–99). And he is a regular guest on CICT-TV's "The Breakfast Show" in Calgary as a political commentator. Taras received a BA from Sir George Williams University and both an MA and PhD in political science from the University of Toronto. He is also a graduate of the Ontario Legislative Internship Program at Queen's Park.
