An expert in Buddhism and French existentialism, Krishnayya has also studied regional Hindu religious practices and village mythologies. Recently, he has written on the influence of Gandhi on Martin Luther King, and on the nature

of nonviolent political change. Previously, he was a visiting professor at the University of Wisconsin—Madison, Beloit College, Randolph-Macon College, the University of Alabama, and Shelton State Community College. Currently, Krishnayya is site director for the BYU India Study Abroad.
